Faith Formation:

Forming ourselves in our Catholic faith is a foundational element in helping each of us understand and live in the example of Christ.

In support of Catholic Board Improvement Learning Cycle, we work to provide an increased number of faith opportunities and developing an understanding of scripture as it is connected to our daily life. We believe and nourish our faith development through sacramental preparation, liturgical celebrations, sacramental retreats, community service projects, prayer services, staff liturgies, and school wide wellness days. In collaboration with our pastoral team, through pastoral visits, celebrations, and prayer, we work together to nurture the seeds of faith for the community. Our daily morning prayer and formal religious instruction support the understanding of scripture for our students. Our Mindful Mondays incorporate faith centered mediation through our morning reflection led by students from our Wellness, Equity, Diversity and Safe Schools(WEDS) team. Through the pastoral works of our school community, we bring scripture into action as we support local and global community outreach. As a community, we are increasing our student-led faith gatherings are marked with scriptural prayer and reflection to keep us mindful of our journey as people of faith in Christ.

Sacramental Preparation:

Social Justice / Outreach Activities / Charities:

Catholic Social Teachings of the Church root our actions in supporting human dignity and the preferential option of the poor which calls us to serve the most vulnerable in the world.

Our school participates in various activities to support our community partners including ShareLife, St. Vincent de Paul, Helping Hands for Christmas for school families in need, St. Louis Outreach in Peel, Providence Angels, Sick Kids, Share Life, Terry Fox, and local food drives. We recognize Autism Awareness, Orange Day in recognition of the First Nations suffrage in residential schools, Pink Day for anti-bullying and Purple Day- Breaking the Silence on Child Abuse. Through our Spirit Days, we encourage families to donate to ShareLife throughout the year. Our Lady of Providence community unites to support social justice initiatives to impact both local and global needs as we work to developing responsible citizenship.

Framed by the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations (OCSGE), our graduates will be effective communicators, reflective thinkers, lifelong learners, collaborative contributors, caring family members, responsible citizens and discerning believers formed in the Catholic faith community.

We provide varied spiritual, academic and social opportunities for students to reach their potential with the intent to foster and celebrate the God-given gifts and talents of our students.

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

To celebrate the virtues, our Youth Faith Ambassadors lead our school in celebrating our faith in action through student-led liturgies. Through daily prayer, monthly newsletters, staff weekly bulletins and conversations we communicate openly our call to model and live the virtues. As a school community, staff and students celebrate virtues share in communal prayer and recognize the virtues evidenced in our student community.

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

As you walk into the school lobby, the large crucifix, the blessed altar, the Holy Bible and liturgical seasonal symbols adorn the sacred space for all members of the school community on a daily basis. It is reflective of the colour and symbol of the Liturgical Season. In our school foyer, a sacred space with an altar and pews provides a place for class prayer and reflection. Within every classroom, the living sacred space makes us mindful of the faith that we share and work to develop each day. Throughout the year, our front foyer demonstrates the commitment to supporting both local and global charities.
